Legislative Report

Summer recess is taking place from July 1 - August 1, which means that July 1 was the last day for policy committees to meet and report bills, and June 30 was the last day for a legislative measure to qualify for the November 8 general election ballot. This deadline particularly impacts the long-discussed SB 323, which, if passed, will allow nurse practitioners to function within their full scope of practice without supervision of a physician or surgeon. On June 28, SB 323 was set for hearing by the Assembly Committee on Business and Professions. We will keep you updated on the results of this hearing.

The other legislation of note is the increased stringency placed on tobacco products. E-cigarettes are now considered tobacco products, and the legal age to purchase tobacco products has increased to 21 years of age. Additionally, school campuses (including charter schools, school districts, and county offices of education) are to implement a tobacco-free campus policy.

We will continue to keep you updated on legislative milestones that may impact the care and health of our state's youth.
