Legislative Update

This year, the SF Bay Area Legislative Co-Chairs have pioneered a Legislative Collaboration between all the California NAPNAP Chapters in an effort to maximize our voice and impact in the Capitol. We have been meeting on a regular basis since December 2021. The 2022 legislative session just began in January, so at this point bills are starting to be introduced and we are in the process of reviewing bills and selecting which ones we want to support or opine on. This will be ongoing for the next month. We will have a final list of bills we've chosen to support for 2022 at the end of March!

Legislative Update Continued

Other important legislative updates:

AB 890 passed in 2020 with bipartisan legislative support and was signed into law by the Governor. Prior to AB 890, California nurse practitioners (NPs) were unable to practice without a physician present or on-call. The removal of this restriction was consistently cited by independent experts as an important strategy to ensure that California patients have access to health care and to address health disparities in our underserved communities. AB 890 updated the Nursing Practice Act to allow NPs who meet specific criteria to practice without physician supervision.

The policy change established by AB 890 requires additional clarifying language in other sections of California law to ensure that NPs are fully recognized as independent providers. As such, another bill has been introduced, **AB 852** (Wood), which would update the other sections of California law, which govern health care providers, to also include nurse practitioners. Specifically, AB 852:

- Amends the Clinic Laboratory Technology Act to include nurse practitioners in the list of who can perform provider-performed microscopy, which are a specified list of on-site tests health care providers can perform during a patient's visit;
- Ensures that NPs are included in the list of providers that are allowed to provide prescriptions and dispense controlled substances; where respiratory care services may be provided and
- Adds NP offices to the list of places where respiratory care services may be provided and
- Includes NPs in the group of health care professionals whose records are protected from legal discovery.
 - **Latest update: AB 852 passed the full Assembly on a bipartisan 75-3 vote in May 2021. In June 2021, Assemblymember Wood made AB 852 a two-year bill, meaning that the bill can still move forward in 2022 as a vehicle for allowing NPs to practice without physician supervision. The extended timeline gives advocates and legislators additional time for key conversations around AB 890 implementation.**

The APP Fellowship Program provides a 12 month post graduate program to support the transition of APPs (nurse practitioners and physician assistants) to function in complex pediatric subspecialty practice. This is accomplished through a thoughtfully structured and appraised program which offers clinical, didactic, and professional experiences designated in specific clinical tracks. The program aims to support newer APPs in their transition to practice as key members of the healthcare team in providing comprehensive care to patients we serve at LPCH.



Highlights of APP Fellowship Program

- Exposure to professional didactic sessions in topics such as provider wellbeing, healthcare disparities, constructive literature reviews, and advocacy
- Pairing with APP and physician faculty for support during clinical rotations and access to clinical pediatric subspecialty learning resources
- Individualized learning plan and goals throughout the course of the fellowship
- Opportunity to work on professional project and actively participate in committee/taskforces within the Center for Advanced Practice
